

Judith Barlow Prize 2019 Application Form

About the Prize:

This year marks is the 5th Annual Judith Barlow Prize, awarded to a student playwright for an exceptional one-act play inspired by an historic woman playwright and her play. Applications will be accepted between October 1, 2018 and December 31, 2018. Winners will be announced in March 2019.

The first place winner will receive a **\$2500** award.

The second place winner will receive a **\$1000** award.

The professor of the first place winner will also receive a **\$500** prize for introducing the student to the play that inspired her/his one-act.

This Prize was created in conjunction with **History Matters/Back to the Future**, an organization that promotes the study and production of women's plays of the past in colleges and universities and theatres throughout the country and encourages responses to those plays from contemporary playwrights. History Matters/Back to the Future's *One Play At A Time: Historic Women Playwrights Initiative* challenges professors around the country to commit to dedicating one class period per semester to an historic play by a woman playwright.

About Judith E. Barlow:

Professor Emeritus of English and Women's Studies at the University of Albany, SUNY; received her B.A. from Cornell University and her PhD from the University of Pennsylvania; editor of *Plays By American Women 1900-1930*, *Plays By American Women 1930-1960*, and *Women Writers of the Provincetown Playhouse*; author of *Final Acts: The Creation of Three Late O'Neill Plays*, as well as numerous essays on American Drama.

Eligibility:

In order to apply, a student must be currently enrolled in (or have completed in the past 12 months) a class that is participating in History Matters/Back to the Future's *One Play At A Time: Historic Women Playwrights Initiative*.
